



NEW TESTAMENT LESSON

1 Corinthians 11:23-26 (NIV)

²³ For I received from the Lord what I also passed on to you: The Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took bread, ²⁴ and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of me." ²⁵ In the same way, after supper he took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood; do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me." ²⁶ For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

GOSPEL LESSON

John 13:1-17, 31b-35 (NIV)

¹ It was just before the Passover Festival. Jesus knew that the hour had come for him to leave this world and go to the Father. Having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end.

Jesus answered, "Unless I wash you, you have no part with me."

Here ends our Gospel lesson for this evening.

All: Thanks be to God. Amen.

² The evening meal was in progress, and the devil had already prompted Judas, the son of Simon Iscariot, to betray Jesus. ³ Jesus knew that the Father had put all things under his power, and that he had come from God and was returning to God; ⁴ so he got up from the meal, took off his outer clothing, and wrapped a towel around his waist. ⁵ After that, he poured water into a basin and began to wash his disciples' feet, drying them with the towel that was wrapped around him.

⁶ He came to Simon Peter, who said to him, "Lord, are you going to wash my feet?"

⁷Jesus replied, "You do not realize now what I am doing, but later you will understand."

⁸ "No," said Peter, "you shall never wash my feet."

⁹ "Then, Lord," Simon Peter replied, "not just my feet but my hands and my head as well!"

¹⁰ Jesus answered, "Those who have had a bath need only to wash their feet; their whole body is clean. And you are clean, though not every one of you." ¹¹ For he knew who was going to betray him, and that was why he said not every one was clean.

¹² When he had finished washing their feet, he put on his clothes and returned to his place. "Do you understand what I have done for you?" he asked them. ¹³ "You call me 'Teacher' and 'Lord,' and rightly so, for that is what I am. ¹⁴ Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet. ¹⁵ I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you. ¹⁶ Very truly I tell you, no servant is greater than his master, nor is a messenger greater than the one who sent him. ¹⁷ Now that you know these things, you will be blessed if you do them.

³¹ When he was gone, Jesus said, "Now the Son of Man is glorified and God is glorified in him. ³² If God is glorified in him, God will glorify the Son in himself, and will glorify him at once.

³³ "My children, I will be with you only a little longer. You will look for me, and just as I told the Jews, so I tell you now: Where I am going, you cannot come.

³⁴ "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. ³⁵ By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."



STRIPPING OF THE ALTAR

The ancient practice of Stripping the Altar is a vivid and dramatic way of showing the desolation and abandonment of the long night in Gethsemane and what followed. While **Psalm 22 is read aloud** by the congregation, designated persons will pick up the communion elements, candlesticks, decorations and cloths on the altar and the pulpit, then quietly carry them from the Sanctuary.

Tomorrow, Jesus will go to the Cross and die for the sins of the world. And three days later He will be raised from the dead by the glory of the Father. Those days rightly overshadow everything else in our lives. As we leave tonight, let us remember the life and sacrifice of Jesus and the wonderful mysterium we call The Lord's Supper. So as we return tomorrow, we may silently reflect on the sacrifice our Lord willingly makes on our behalf by going to the Cross.

Following this, we ask you to follow the pastor out of the Sanctuary in a quiet reflective tone, focusing on what was about to happen to our Lord.

PSALM 22

¹ My God, my God, why have you abandoned me? Why are you so far away when I groan for help?

² Every day I call to you, my God, but you do not answer.

Every night I lift my voice, but I find no relief.

³ Yet you are holy,

enthroned on the praises of Israel

⁴ Our ancestors trusted in you, and you rescued them

⁵ They cried out to you and were saved.

They trusted in you and were never disgraced.

⁶ But I am a worm and not a man.

I am scorned and despised by all!

⁷ Everyone who sees me mocks me

They sneer and shake their heads, saying,

⁸ "Is this the one who relies on the Lord?

Then let the Lord save him!

If the Lord loves him so much, let the Lord rescue him!"

⁹ Yet you brought me safely from my mother's womb and led me to trust you at my mother's breast.

¹⁰ I was thrust into your arms at my birth.

You have been my God from the moment I was born.

Do not stay so far from me, for trouble is near,

and no one else can help me.

My enemies surround me like a herd of bulls; fierce bulls of Bashan have hemmed me in!

Like lions they open their jaws against me, roaring and tearing into their prey.

¹⁴ My life is poured out like water,

and all my bones are out of joint.

My heart is like wax, melting within me.

My strength has dried up like sunbaked clay.

My tongue sticks to the roof of my mouth.

You have laid me in the dust and left me for dead.

My enemies surround me like a pack of dogs; an evil gang closes in on me.

They have pierced my hands and feet.

¹⁷ I can count all my bones.

My enemies stare at me and gloat.

They divide my garments among themselves and throw dice for my clothing.

¹⁹ O Lord, do not stay far away!

You are my strength; come quickly to my aid!

²⁰ Save me from the sword;

spare my precious life from these dogs.

²¹ Snatch me from the lion's jaws

and from the horns of these wild oxen.

²² I will proclaim your name to my brothers and sisters.
I will praise you among your assembled people.

²³ Praise the Lord, all you who fear him! Honor him, all you descendants of Jacob!

Show him reverence, all you descendants of Israel!

For he has not ignored or belittled the suffering of the needy. He has not turned his back on them,

but has listened to their cries for help.

²⁵ I will praise you in the great assembly.

I will fulfill my vows in the presence of those who worship you.

²⁶ The poor will eat and be satisfied.

All who seek the Lord will praise him.

Their hearts will rejoice with everlasting joy.

The whole earth will acknowledge the Lord and return to him. All the families of the nations will bow down before him.

²⁸ For royal power belongs to the Lord.

He rules all the nations.

²⁹ Let the rich of the earth feast and worship. Bow before him, all who are mortal, all whose lives will end as dust.

³⁰ Our children will also serve him.

Future generations will hear about the wonders of the Lord.

³¹ His righteous acts will be told to those not yet born. They will hear about everything he has done.
